WHAT MAKES KING'S MAGNA DIFFERENT

King's Magna is a unique middle school, where visitors often comment that there is a 'palpable sense of respect' between students and staff, and amongst students themselves. Small class sizes enable staff to devote maximum time and energy to ensuring that each student can make the most of their talents.

Students enjoy the sense of belonging to a smaller school within the Collegiate; they have the chance to get to know each other and their teachers very well, and they flourish as a result. King's Magna shares many facilities with the Collegiate's senior schools, enabling an extensive and varied programme of lunchtime and after-school activities, within a safe and secure environment in which students can grow in confidence.

The academic curriculum within King's Magna is challenging, stimulating and varied, and is supported by an exciting activity programme, developing skills in community, creativity, culture, health and leadership. Our Year 6 programme of study is designed in partnership between experienced secondary specialists and primary practitioners, creating a unique bridge between Key Stages 2 and 3. This builds the foundation of a curriculum characterised by independence, curiosity and a love of learning, clearly evident in our Year 6 topic-based work, where literature, history and geography are blended together in the study of topics such as the civil rights movement or post-war Britain. By Year 9, our students are ready to take advantage of the opportunities presented by the introduction of a number of stimulating option choices, which allow them to follow a bespoke curriculum. They are guided in their choices through an extensive package of support, ensuring that their decisions are well-informed and best suited to their personal educational journey. This prepares them well for the next stage of their learning and the transition to the College or Faculty.

We value our engagement with parents, who are provided with opportunities to meet and talk with teachers, on a regular basis, to discuss progress and aspirations. Assessment statements are provided to parents each half term, in addition to a comprehensive end-of-year report. We actively seek to establish strong partnerships with parents and encourage three-way communication between the student, the parents or guardian and the school.

THE KING'S MAGNA EDUCATIONAL JOURNEY

As an independent school, our innovative curriculum is both relevant and challenging.

Modern programmes of study foster curiosity and equip students with the skills and knowledge they need to move seamlessly through to the senior schools.

In King's Magna, we are ambitious to achieve the full potential of each individual, and, as a result, our curriculum is reviewed each year to ensure that it provides a broad and balanced education - one that is both engaging and exciting for all.

Outstanding specialist provision in the creative arts, sport, languages, history, geography, computing and personal development complements the core curriculum of mathematics, English and science. We encourage students to be actively involved in, and responsible for, their own learning, with regular progress points and conversations, which allow them to reflect on their achievements and set targets for further improvement.

Year 6 - Firm foundations and memorable moments

Year 6 offers a unique and innovative bridge between Key Stages 2 and 3. Creating memorable moments is a key part of the students' learning journey.

Year 7 - Developing independence

In Year 7, our students are encouraged to become more independent and take greater responsibility for their own learning, with significant challenge for all learners.

Year 8- Taking responsibility

In Year 8, students are encouraged to take on additional responsibilities and apply for a variety of key roles within the school community. These include being a Prefect, Buddy, a Chapter House Mentor, School Ambassador, Food Council representative or School Council representative.

Year 9 - Aspirational, confident and prepared

In Year 9, a bespoke curriculum, alongside far-reaching extra-curricular and leadership opportunities, means students are fully prepared to confidently meet the challenges of the next stage of their educational journey.

ENRICHMENT

With around 100 activities to choose from each week, including contemporary dance, Combined Cadet Force, trampolining, fencing, chess, Lego club, digital design, parkour and comic making, there really is something for everyone. Through enthusiastic participation, students are provided with opportunities to take responsibility and initiative, and are encouraged to enjoy and take pride in their endeavour, as well as their success.

TEAM QE - SPORT FOR ALL

King's Magna students enjoy sport with highly-qualified and experienced teachers and coaches.

The exceptional facilities on campus enable us to deliver successfully a wide range of sporting activities. Students take part in regular competitive fixtures for rugby, hockey, swimming, basketball, netball, football, rounders, cricket and athletics. King's Magna school teams enter Independent Schools Association (ISA) sporting competitions, as part of TEAM QE, and have achieved success at a national level in athletics, rugby, hockey and football. Dance and gymnastics are extremely popular, and each year over 100 students from King's Magna take part in our Gym and Dance display.

Our Performance Sports Programme is available to all students from Year 7 and offers specialist high-level coaching for those students wishing to pursue their chosen sport at county level and above. The Performance Sports Programme is designed with individual talent development as the key component and is available in athletics, basketball, cricket, football, hockey, netball, rugby and swimming.

The creative arts offer a wealth of experiences for students in King's Magna, an area which is greatly valued across the Collegiate.

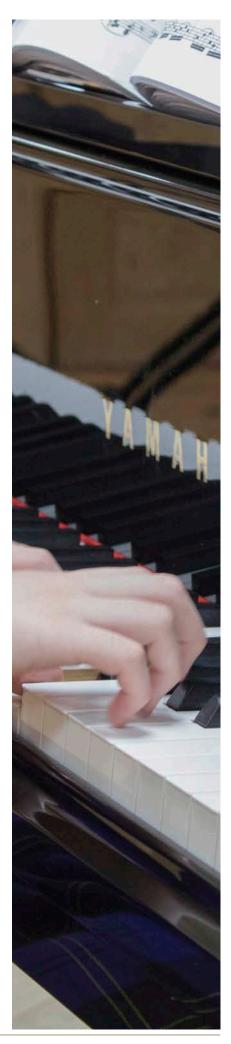
We are passionate about encouraging opportunities for everyone to engage with the arts, and the King's Theatre is the perfect backdrop for showcasing the work created by our talented students.

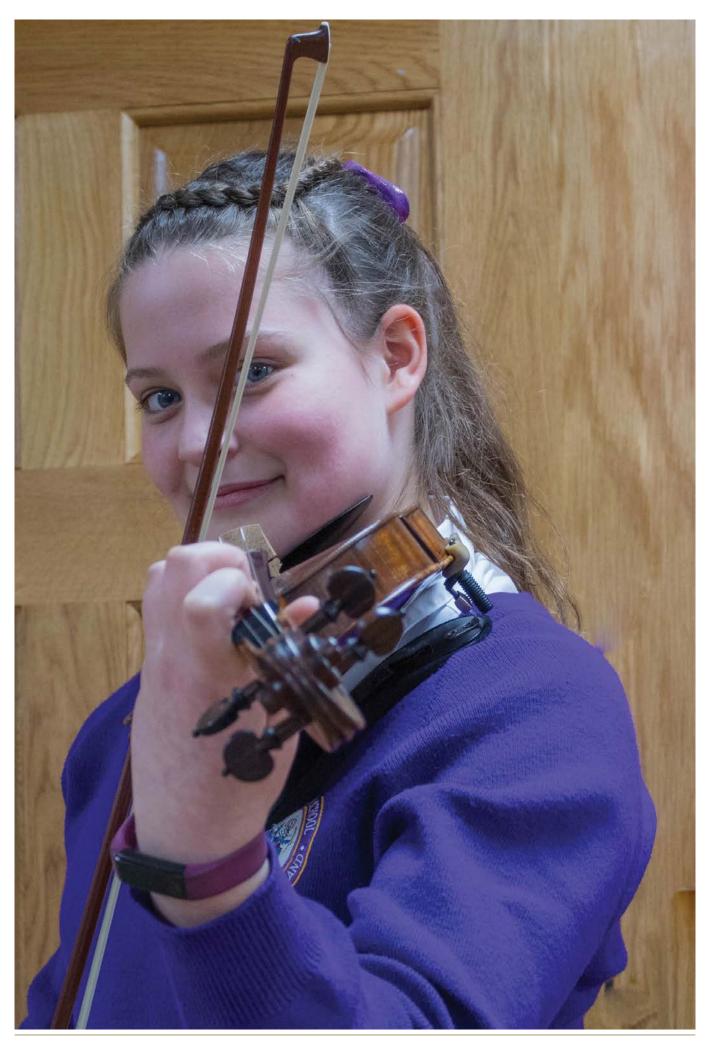
Dedicated drama lessons and a range of co-curricular activities, including private LAMDA tuition, provide students in King's Magna with opportunities to perform in public, develop their creativity in acting and grow in confidence as individuals. Drama also offers numerous opportunities, throughout the year, for students to perform in large-scale, whole-school productions and smaller ones, including our own annual King's Magna performance.

As students progress through the school, they learn more about instruments, music and performance, both as solo performers and as part of an ensemble. Our enrichment programme contains a diverse range of music activities, with the most popular ones being KM choir, orchestra, woodwind ensemble, musical theatre singing and the ipad band. We encourage students to develop skills, not only as performers, but also to appreciate the beauty of music and the benefits it can bring as a global language. Music is delivered, in spacious and well-equipped accommodation, by talented teachers and peripatetic staff, who are all experts in their specialist area, be that composition, performance, digital music or musical theatre.

COMMUNITY AND CHARITY

King's Magna is a happy and caring community where students are encouraged to contribute their voice to the running of our school.

Membership of the School, Boarding and Food Councils allows students to influence key decision-making processes in the school, while roles such as Prefects, School and Anti-bullying Ambassadors and Buddies allow students to promote the positive and supportive ethos of King's Magna and the QE community values.

Students are also encouraged to contribute positively to the lives of others within school, the local community and wider society, whether through small acts of kindness or organised charitable work. Annually, we support over 20 charities, including four dedicated charities which are nominated by the academic houses, and every member of our community takes part in our annual Race for Life during Cancer Awareness Week.

PASTORAL CARE: THRIVE@QE

The well-being of students is paramount, and in King's Magna we provide a safe and secure environment in a supportive, close community, where students can thrive, both mentally and physically.

THRIVE@QE is our innovative pastoral programme, developed to promote well-being and resilience in students throughout their QE journey. With over 30 different sessions each week, King's Magna students take full advantage of what is on offer and engage readily with the dedicated Pastoral Team. This may include taking part in individual support sessions, joining specialist-led mindfulness classes or taking part in whole-school well-being weeks.

"Pastoral care is something that is based around the students' needs. This means that at any time you always have someone to talk to. There are different sessions that the pastoral staff have set up to help us and some of these sessions were set up by students. It also offers peer mentors. Peer mentors are people in year 12 and 13 who help the younger children with school work, friendships, or if you just want someone to talk to." Year 7 student.

QE KITCHEN - HEALTHY FOOD FOR A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE

Students are supported in progressing through school as healthy, well-informed young adults, able to be independent and go on to enjoy successful and sustainable lifestyles.

Our award-winning in-house catering team facilitate this by creating menus that meet the Government Buying Standards and the Food for Life school award and are developed in conjunction with our onsite PhD nutritionist. Our student Food Council meets regularly with the catering team, to provide ideas and feedback, ensuring that the food that is served is popular with everyone in our community.

A typical day's menu will include:

BOARDING – A HOME FROM HOME

Our students enjoy some of the best boarding facilities that are on offer in the UK, supported by a dedicated team of house tutors, who ensure that everyone is looked after in a safe, happy and productive environment.

Boarding at QE offers facilities which supports our students' development and allows them to thrive. All boarding bedrooms are air-conditioned and have private en-suite bathrooms with a toilet and shower. Common rooms are also provided for all boarders, so that students can come together and socialise.

King's Magna boarders have access to fantastic sports facilities, which encourage them to maintain a healthy lifestyle and manage their own fitness, with the support of gym staff, teachers and coaches. A busy activities and trips programme at the weekends ensures that students have plenty of opportunities to broaden their experience and enjoy new challenges with their friends.

Our newly-opened boarding and pastoral facility in Bronte House is accessible for students throughout the day, well into the evening and at weekends, and is supervised by pastoral staff. Here, students can come and meet a Peer Mentor or Buddy, chat to staff and receive help with anything they might need.

"For me boarding was one of the best decisions I have ever made. I remember my dad asking if I wanted a taster day and I loved it. The minute I left, I instantly wanted to come back and enjoy learning, but I also met people I never thought I would get a chance to meet. The best way to describe boarding is a home and a family. It's like having lots of siblings that you wish you will never have to leave. You have a room with 2-3 people which is shared between a living place with a working space, that makes it feel homely. The boarding life is well structured from organising our laundry, to baking and playing games". Year 7 student.
